Prof. Mark Solms (PhD)

Best known for his discovery of the forebrain mechanisms of dreaming, and for his integration of psychoanalytic theories and methods with those of modern neuroscience. He holds the Chair of Neuropsychology at the University of Cape Town and Groote Schuur Hospital (Departments of Psychology and Neurology) and is President of the South African Psychoanalytical Association. He is also currently Research Chair of the International Psychoanalytical Association and Science Director of the American Psychoanalytic Association. He was the Founding Editor of the journal *Neuropsychanalysis* in 1999 and founded the International Neuropsychanalysis Society in 2000. He is the authorized editor and translator of the forthcoming Revised Standard Edition of the Complete Psychological Works of Sigmund Freud (24 vols), and the Complete Neuroscientific Works of Sigmund Freud (4 vols). His most recent books are *The Feeling Brain* (Karnac) and *Beyond Evolutionary Psychology* (Cambridge). His earlier book, *The Brain and the Inner World* (Karnac) was a best-seller which was translated into 13 languages

Shimon Marom (MD, PhD)

Professor of Physiology and Biophysics, and the Seiden Academic Chair of Sciences at the Technion–Israel Institute of Technology. His theoretical and experimental work focuses on self-organization of proteins, neurons and networks embedded in responsive and adaptive environments, implementing closed-loop experimental designs and natural input statistics. In a recent excursion to the field of critical thinking, Marom offers a relational framework as a space for dialogue between physiology and psychology; an alternative to biological determinism that has plagued current approaches to psychology.

Dr. Sharon Ziv-Beiman (PhD)

Faculty in the Academic College of Tel-Aviv Yaffo, Head of "Mifrasim Institute for Psychotherapy Training and Research" in the School for Behavioral Sciences at the Academic College of Tel Aviv Yaffo including heading "Ogen – Integration Based Psychotherapy Training Program" as part of the institute, former chair of the Israeli Forum for Relational Psychoanalysis and Psychotherapy and former board member of IARPP, co-manager of "Siach Group - an Institute for Relational Psychotherapy" Tel Aviv, private practice Tel Aviv.

Prof. Amir Horowitz (PhD)

The main research areas of Prof. Amir Horowitz are philosophy of mind and cognitive science, philosophy of language, and experimental philosophy. He published articles on the mind-body problem, consciousness, intentionality and reference, and mental causation. Occasionally he writes on issues in other philosophical areas, such as ethics, philosophy of law and philosophy of sport. Currently he is writing a monograph titled "Intentionality Deconstructed", in which he defends the idea that that no concrete entities (e.g., neither mental states nor linguistic acts) possess content or meaning. Amir established a cognitive science program and is serving as the head of the philosophy program in the open university of Israel.

Dr. Yochai Ataria (PhD)

Senior lecturer at Tel-Hai College, Israel. He conducted his post-doctoral research in the Neurobiology Department at the Weizmann Institute of Science. He is the author of the following books: *The Structural Trauma of Western Culture* (2017); *Body Disownership in Complex Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder* (2018); *The Mathematics of Trauma* [Hebrew] (2014); *Not in our Brain* [Hebrew] (2019). In addition, he co-edited the following volumes: *Interdisciplinary Handbook of Culture and Trauma* (2016); *Linkages between Torture, Severe Trauma, and Suicide* (2019); *Kafka: New Perspectives* [Hebrew] (2013); *The End of the Human Era* [Hebrew] (2016); *2001: A Space Odyssey – 50th Anniversary* [Hebrew] (2019)

Ms. Smadar Steinbock

Clinical Psychologist, Training and Supervisory Psychoanalyst, President of the Israel Psychoanalytic Society. Faculty, IPS, Israel Winnicott Center. Private practice with adults and children in Tel Aviv.

Ms. Tali Lavi

Clinical Psychologist Supervisor (in training) at Maccabi Healthcare Services. A member of the Israeli Neuropsychanalysis Forum since 2007. Heading a study group exploring developmental aspects of consciousness from a neuropsychanalytical perspective. Private practice with children, adolescents, and adults in Tel Aviv.

Rami Aronzon, M.D.

Practicing psychiatrist, psychoanalyst and psychotherapist in Jerusalem. He is a member of The Israel Psychoanalytic association. He was the head of the outpatient services at Talbieh Mental Health Centre for more than two decades. Today he is a consultant, teacher and supervisory psychiatrist at several mental health facilities. For years he worked summers as the general medical officer in northern Norway.

Dr. Anna Sverdlik

Psychiatrist of The Department of Head Trauma Rehabilitation, Sheba Tel Hashomer Hospital. Her main field of interest is embodied cognition. The author of the book *"How Our Emotions And Bodies Are Vital for Abstract Thought: Perfect Mathematics for Imperfect Minds"* (Routledge, 2018).

Neta Ofer

The founder of AEDP (Accelerated Experiential Dynamic Psychotherapy) in Israel, part of the senior faculty of the school of "New Wave Psychotherapy", Baruch Ivcher School of Psychology, Interdisciplinary Center (IDC), Herzliya and Geha Mental Health Center.
