Mark Solms will outline some recent neuroscientific findings that suggest major revisions of psychoanalytic theory are required that might

have implications for clinical practice. His outline of these will prepare the way for the afternoon case presentation, in which the usefulness (or otherwise) of the proposed revisions may be tested.
